David Bowie's Legacy Takes Center Stage at Brooklyn Museum's Target First Saturday on April 7

On April 7, *Target First Saturday* celebrates David Bowie's legacy with a special lineup of programs with Bowie's former collaborators and contemporary Brooklyn artists. Highlights include music by **Mike Garson** and **Tamarkali**; a Bowie-inspired **photo booth**; and a performance by **Bushwig** hosted by **Horrorchata**, **Untitled Queen**, and **Tyler Ashley**.

Brooklyn Museum's *Target First Saturday* events attract thousands of visitors to free art and entertainment programs each month. Some *Target First Saturday* programs have limited space and are ticketed on a first-come, first-served basis. *Denotes a ticketed event.

*5–6 pm Book Club: Simon Critchley, Professor of Philosophy at the New School, discusses his 2014 book *Bowie*, which melds personal narratives and philosophical musings on the iconic musician. Signed books will be available in our Shop.

*6–7 pm Music: Legendary pianist Mike Garson, who toured and collaborated with David Bowie on over one thousand concerts, kicks off the night with an electric performance.

*6–8 pm Hands-On Art: Create a Bowie-inspired painting using watercolors.

6–9 pm Photo Booth: Take a Bowie-inspired photo with a selection of props and accessories.

6–9 pm Drink and Draw: Grab a drink and sketch from live models dressed as David Bowie.

6:30–8:30 pm Performance: Bushwig, known for their annual festival of innovative and emerging talent in the drag community, take over the Beaux-Arts Court for a special Bowie-themed showcase hosted by Horrorchata, Untitled Queen, and Tyler Ashley.





7–8 pm Pop-Up Gallery Talks: Teen Apprentices host ten-minute talks about portraiture and crafting identity through works of art in our *American Art* galleries.

*9–10:30 pm Film: A screening of Ziggy Stardust and the Spiders from Mars (D. A. Pennebaker, 1979, 91 min.), a documentary capturing Bowie and his band at London's Hammersmith Odeon, where he marked the end of the Ziggy Stardust persona in 1973.

*9–10 pm Music: Singer-songwriter Tamar-kali performs original work and a tribute to David Bowie as both a legendary musician and fan of her work.
