The Brooklyn Museum Presents the Eighteenth Annual Brooklyn Children's Book Fair on November 10

Hosted in the Museum's Beaux-Arts Court, the largest Brooklyn Children's Book Fair to date features more than 40 Brooklyn-based authors and illustrators in an afternoon of presentations and children's activities.

The Brooklyn Museum is pleased to announce the Eighteenth Annual Brooklyn Children's Book Fair on Sunday, November 10, from 11 am to 3:30 pm. Our largest fair to date, this year's event brings together over 40 Brooklyn authors and illustrators to share their latest works.

Free and open to the public, the fair features storybooks, picture books, chapter books, and graphic novels—fiction and nonfiction—for preschoolers to middle schoolers. Highlights include books in Hindi and Mandarin, along with works on topics as diverse as Ocean Parkway, Mars, Edward Gorey, trains, the ABCs, Prince, and poetry. Throughout the day, children can chat with authors and illustrators, listen to readings and watch artists sketch, get books signed, meet social media star Maxine the Fluffy Corgi, and participate in book-related art projects.
