Brooklyn Museum Public Programs for Adults, Teens, and Kids in February 2017

The Brooklyn Museum will present a variety of programs for adults, teens, and kids in February. Explore the recently rediscovered letters of Jane Schenck and Ralph Malbone, two young lovers from early nineteenth-century Brooklyn. For more than five years, they corresponded in secret, with their passion surviving the disapproval of Jane's parents, the War of 1812, a smallpox epidemic, and accusations of an illegitimate child. The evening begins with a tour in our Library with a presentation by Giana Ricci, Libraries and Archives Kress NYARC Fellow, followed by a small reception.
