Celebrate the Best of the Borough at Brooklyn Museum's *Target First Saturday* on November 4

On November 4, Target First Saturday celebrates the best of Brooklyn in an evening of performance, scholarship, film, and literature with local tastemakers and artists. Highlights include musical performances by Alsarah & the Nubatones, Phony Ppl, and DJ Ian Friday; dance performances presented by the Brooklyn Dance Festival; and a live score by Hisham Bharoocha of a Sergei Eisenstein film in the exhibition Proof: Francisco Goya, Sergei Eisenstein, Robert Longo.

*6–8 pm Hands-On Art: Create a self-portrait inspired by Mickalene Thomas's painting A Little Taste Outside of Love, with found materials and embellishments.

7:30 pm Music: A performance by Brooklyn's Phony Ppl that melds astral funk, soul, and rap.



8–10 pm Film Screening and Live Score: Brooklynbased musician and multimedia artist Hisham Akira Bharoocha conducts a live score for Sergei Eisenstein's classic film *Strike* (1925, 82 min.). Featuring musicians Angel Deradoorian, Jeremy Hyman, Nicos Kennedy, and Joe Williams.

8:30–10 pm Music: DJ Ian Friday closes the evening with global soul, in a tribute to his home borough.
